

SEE IT WHILE YOU CAN

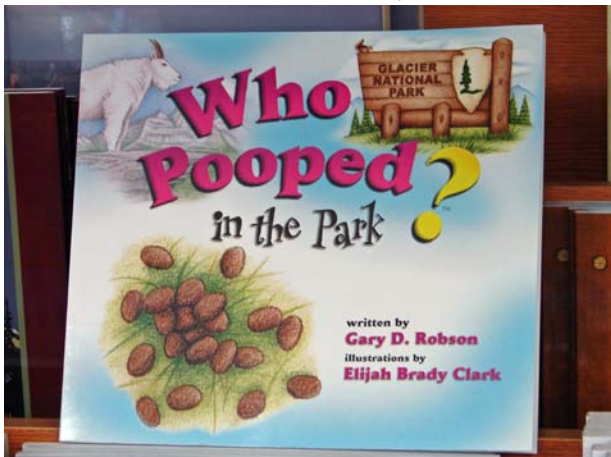
