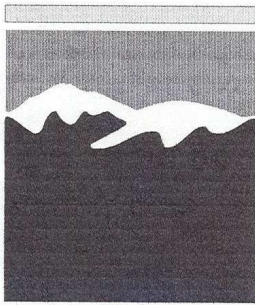
## Almost meeting Don and Diane Lowry
