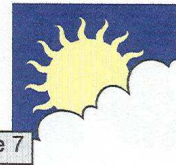

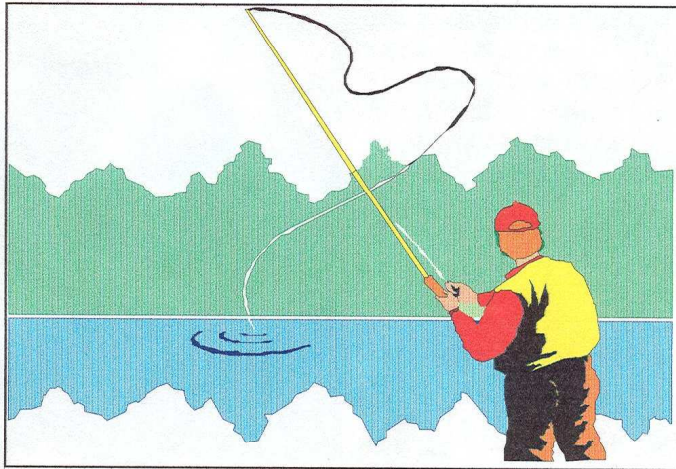
SUMMER'S COMING, THE DAYS ARE LONG
