We left this morning after reading in the Milepost that the road ahead was "steep, 10% climbs, rough road, crooked and narrow".

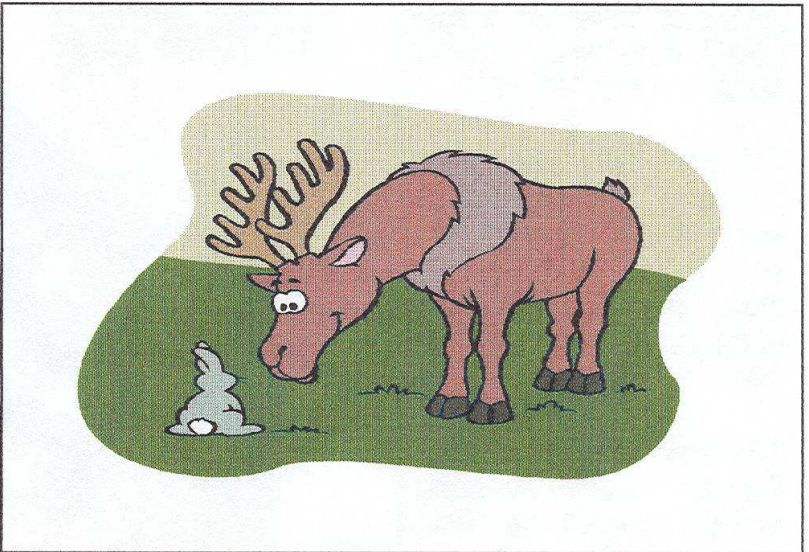
The road to Running Springs at home is worse than yhat, at least so far.
