## THE DREADED CONSTRUCTION AREA!

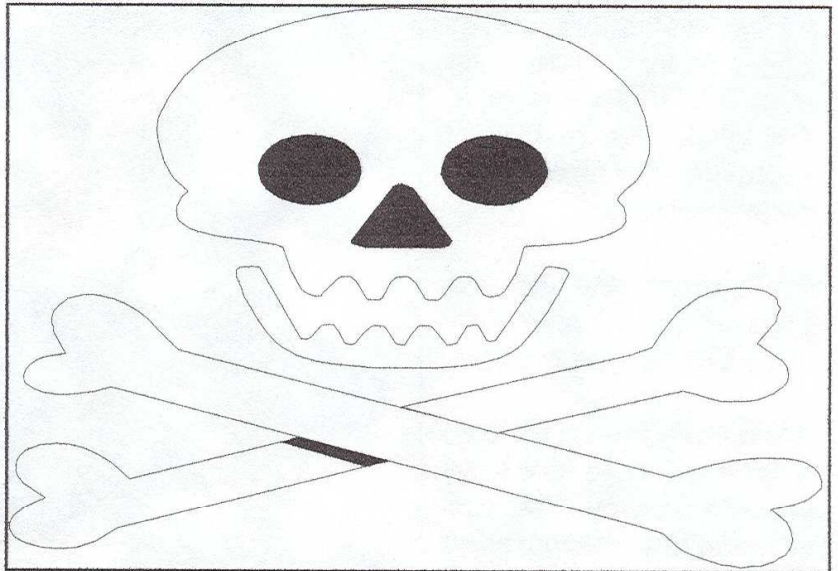
**R**ain all night at Beaver Creek. The 80 miles of dreaded construction lay ahead!
