This morning we left for Stewart and Hyder. They are very picturesque towns. Going out of town we arrived at a wildlife platform by a stream where salmon were spawning.

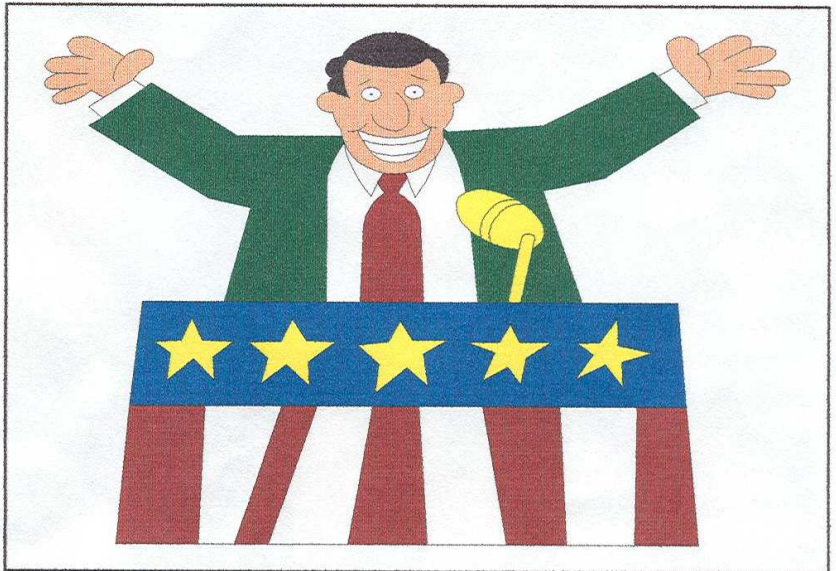
There were 3 bears in the river catching salmon. We saw a Bald Eagle and a Golden Eagle there also
